



FAIRFIELD COUNTY 4-H SENIOR COUNTY MEDAL AWARDS

(Must be 13 years or older as of January 1 of this year)

The process of awarding Senior county Medals is based on the Danish System. Seniors must document a standard of excellence in a specific project area in order to receive a county medal. The following criteria are used by the Development Committee for selection of county medals:

- 1. Accomplishment in a specific 4-H project area, participation in activities and events in the area of the award and other leadership experiences in the application area.
- 2. Length of time in the project.
- 3. A completed application includes a medal application, leader recommendation and a complete and up-to-date record book.
- 4. Incomplete or late applications will not be considered.

Please note: It is highly unlikely that a senior in the first year of their project will qualify to earn a medal in a given project area.

Eligibility Rules for Senior County Medals:

- 1. Members must be 13 as of January 1 of the current 4-H year and must not have passed their 19th birthday by January 1 of the current 4-H year.
- 2. Members must have been enrolled in 4-H for at least two years.
- 3. The Leader's recommendation must be received in the 4-H office by May 1.
- 4. A submitted record book, completed to date, must contain Activity Records and Project Records for all years in 4-H. The current year's Activity Record and Project Record should appear first in the record book. Subsequent years should follow.

REMEMBER – the Project Record submitted must match the medal you are applying for. For example: if you are applying for a medal in Leadership, you must submit a Project Record in Leadership, even if your main project is Nature. **The exception to this is if you are applying for an Achievement Medal.** Achievement does not have a Project Record. If you are applying for an Achievement medal:

- *submit a medal application for Achievement
- *make sure your recommendation stresses all of your achievements since you joined 4-H or received your last Achievement medal, and
 - *submit your record book, completed to date.
- 5. Members may receive more than one county medal in a year, BUT applicants must complete a project record and application for each medal application.
- 6. When a senior is applying for the first time in a given project area, all work (even that done as a junior) is counted. That is why it is important to submit your whole record book, not just the current year. Members may receive a county medal award more than once in the same project area only when outstanding growth is shown in the project.
- 7. Seniors are strongly encouraged to make a copy of each application.
