Are you a New England 4-H Carded Judge or Steward?

Your card must be renewed annually to remain a current New England 4-H Horse Show Official. Additionally, judges must attend an accepted judges' school every three years, including the live judging session, and complete the rulebook test attaining a minimum score of 85%.

Judges who last attended an accepted school in 2019 or before, must attend in 2023 to remain eligible for the New England list. If this is the only card you hold, please note there will not be another New England School until 2025. Judges currently on our list may renew without attending school in 2023, providing they send proof of attendance at an accepted 4-H judges' school in 2021 or 2022.

The New England 4-H Horse Show Rules & Judge Education Program accepts attendance at multiple 4-H judge's schools. First Time Attending New England 4-H Judges' School?

Welcome! We look forward to meeting you and we are eager to know how you first heard about New England Judges' School. A wealth of knowledge and a network of experienced judges and mentors awaits you. For your initial application, our program developed the below prerequisites for each carded level:

Novice Judges – These are individuals just embarking on their judging career. They have a good working knowledge of horse judging and may or may not have been part of a 4-H, youth or college horse judging team. They may currently be judging with experienced judges. They are qualified to judge small shows independently.

Novice Level Prerequisites

- Must be at least 18 years of age
- Complete application
- Must attend an accepted school in initial application year
- Complete NEJS live judging session
- Complete rulebook test with score ≥85%

Skilled B Judges – These are experienced judges qualified and interested in judging most shows. May or may not be interested in judging extremely large shows.

New England 4-H Horse Show Rules & Judge Education Program DESIGNATION OF OFFICIALS

The designation of being a New England 4-H Horse Show Judge or Steward is a privilege. Qualifications that the New England 4-H Horse Show Rules & Judge Education Program is searching for include equine expertise, personal character and an interest in the New England and all 4-H Youth Horse Programs. Professional conduct is expected at all times. Status as an approved New England 4-H Horse Show Judge or Steward may be revoked by the New England 4-H Horse Show Rules & Judge Education Program's Selection Committee at any time without a formal hearing. As a courtesy, the Program's Selection Committee may grant a 60-day notice if possible. No privilege of appeal shall be available. A rejected applicant may re-apply one year after date of rejection. An additional fee is required for this application.

The information on this application is accurate and true to the best of my knowledge. I fully understand any inaccuracies or discrepancies will be considered unfavorable in my application. Furthermore, I understand that the designated authorities of the New England 4-H Horse Show Rules & Judge Education Program have the right to accept or deny this application, as well as the right to withdraw my name from the New England 4-H Horse Judges' List at any time. I will not challenge the Program's acceptance or rejection of my application, or its decision to remove me if so moved. I agree to abide by the rules and regulations of the New England 4-H Horse Show Rulebook & Guidelines, and the Code of Conduct in consideration for the addition of my name to the New England 4-H Horse Judges' List. I also understand that failure to do so may result in my removal from said list.

I understand that being a New England 4-H Horse Show Rules & Judge Education Program Judge and/or Steward is a privilege, not a right, and I will uphold my status with dignity and respect. At any time if my conduct violates this, my status could be revoked by the board of this committee.
I will refrain from any alcohol use before and during my official duties.
I will report to the Committee anything that could be a bribe, or an attempt to bribe me in my judging capacities.
I agree to act professionally at all times, treat each person and animal with respect, and make decisions ethically with integrity and with the intent to grow the industry and educate both children and adults to the best of my ability. I also agree to use social media in a professional manner and I understand that my status as a judge could come into question should I violate the use of social media.
I recognize that 4-H is a positive youth development education organization, engaging youth and volunteers in their area of interest and fostering a sense of belonging in members and volunteers and I will frame any communications with youth and volunteers with this in mind.
I agree to continue my education and look for ways to learn and grow as a judge, with the priority being to stay current on all rules and regulations, along with industry standards.

I agree to be courteous and respectful, demonstrate good sportsmanship and deal with conflicts in a tactful manner.
