A special award will be presented at the Middlesex and New Haven Achievement Night Program to Middlesex 4-H members who successfully complete 5 mandatory requirements and 12 elective requirements. The requirements must be met from October 1 through September 30. *Please write in the dates of the completed activity in the space provided.* **All forms must include a leader's signature and a parent or guardian's signature.** Completed forms should be emailed to [Emily.alger@uconn.edu](mailto:Emily.alger@uconn.edu) AND [Donna.dione@uconn.edu](mailto:Donna.dione@uconn.edu) with the subject line reading "Current Year 4-H Awards" (i.e., "2023 4-H Awards"). Section 1	
Date	<b>Mandatory Requirements</b> – All 5 must be met to qualify.
	1. Submit for judging at least one project to the annual 4-H Fair.
	2. Submit for evaluation your record book.
	3. Participate in a county or state level 4-H Activity or volunteer at the Middlesex County 4-H Auction.
	4. Prepare and present a demonstration, talk or speech at the Public Presentation Program, at a 4-H informational meeting or for your club.
	5. Participate in 20 hours of community service.

Section 2	
Date	<b>Elective Requirements</b> – 12 of the following must be successfully completed to qualify.
	1. Be able to recite from memory the 4-H pledge.
	2. Serve in a leadership position either as a club officer, committee chairperson, 4-H Fair officer, junior leader, or 4-H Fair manager or superintendent.
	3. Submit for judging a second project at the 4-H Fair.
	4. Complete 60 hours of 4-H work annually.
	5. Collect a donation for the 4-H Auction or assist with a 4-H sponsored event.
	6. Visit a 4-H club meeting.
	7. Attend 2 business meetings of the 4-H Fair Association. (January-July)
	8. Submit to a media source an article about your club's activities.
	9. Attend a project workshop or clinic of your choice.
	10. Teach a 4-H skill to another 4-H member.
	11. Complete/submit a Jr. awards form or CT 4-H Recognition form by the correct date.
	12. Sell ads or sponsorships for the 4-H Fair or collect donations for the 4-H Fair.
	13. Submit a project for judging at another Connecticut Fair.
	14. Participate in an approved safety program. (First Aid, CPR, fire safety, lifeguard training, etc...)
	15. Be directly responsible for having a new member join 4-H. (club or individual)
	16. Make a poster, exhibit or another promotional article for 4-H.
	17. Enter artwork in the 4-H Fair Artwork Contest.
	18. Enter a Fair Theme in the Fair Theme Contest.
	19. Participate in a regional or national event. (ESE, Washington Focus, Eastern National Round-up)
	20. Help with set up or clean up for the 4-H Fair or a county level 4-H event.
	21. Attend 4-H Camp.
