

We are a 4-H Youth Club that focuses on science, engineering, and technology in the robotics community. Our aim is to teach our youth life skills, leadership, and responsibility for the future with advances in robotics sciences.

PowerSurge 4-H Robotics, team # 2712, is 1 of 55 FIRST Robotics Competition teams in CT.

FIRST Robotics Competition (FRC) is an international high school robotics competition. Each year, teams of high school students, coaches, and mentors; under strict rules with limited time and resources, are challenged to build industrial-size robots to play a difficult field game in alliance with other teams.

We are always looking for new youth members, adult mentors and corporate sponsors that have interests in advancing any field of business, science, engineering, and technology.

- To be a member, we are looking for youths ages 13-18, from any school or home school.
- To be a mentor, it's by application and must pass a background check, but we typically need help with administrator, media, engineering, tool making, CAD, or computer science.
- To be a sponsor, if you're interested in advancing youth through robotics, our club's goal is to raise \$15-20k per year from sponsorship. All sponsorship donations cover the cost of purchasing new equipment, parts and services, and FRC competition fees.

The team hosts its own community fundraising events throughout the year to cover entertainment, food and travel.

There is never a bad time to join our club, but our season generally runs from September to July.

Our meetings are held at "Aces at Chase" in Waterbury.

September through December is our Learning Season. We meet twice a week and learn new technologies, practice building robots, and hold outreach events at Bethlehem Fair, Big E along with fundraising and a charitable event.

January through March/April is Build Season, dedicated to FRC Competition, design and building our robot and compete in 2 weekend events.

April through July is our FUN season, where we meet to do whatever, we want, team building events, and end of season parties.





A QUICK LOOK at the FAIRFIELD COUNTY 4-H FAIR

The FAIR is Saturday, October 12, 2024. Registration deadline for everything- exhibits, workshops, lunch/volunteers & community service is *September 27*. **Exhibits must be pre-registered**.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Some of the goals of our Fair are to provide an evaluation for 4-H exhibits; provide educational experiences for members; and to provide an opportunity for 4-Hers from different clubs to get to know each other. If these goals are to be accomplished, 4-Hers need to stay for the entire day. PLEASE make every effort to do this. *As a reminder, 4-Hers must set up their own exhibits and exhibits cannot be removed until the end of the day after closing ceremonies. Fair premiums will be mailed. FC 4-H Fair Admission is \$3 per 4-H Member, Adult and Siblings! One Zoo ticket for the 4-H Member and One for their Guardian. *All others pay the entrance fee into the Zoo.

EXHIBITS (starts on page 15)

- → If you are planning to complete the Super 4-Her form due May 1, 2025, you must exhibit at least one item at this Fair 2024.
 - Read the Exhibit Guidelines and specific division requirements carefully! Some requirements
 may have changed. Items must be exhibited exactly as indicated in the directions or it will
 result in a lower score. If you have questions, Allison C fairfieldcounty4hexhibits@gmail.com
 or the 4-H office.

*Points will be deducted from projects not exhibited according to the directions.

What is an Exhibit??

An exhibit is anything you have created, collected, built or written since last years' Fair. It does not have to be related to your 4-H project you are currently working on in your club or independently.

- \rightarrow Exhibits created and submitted by two or more members <u>must</u> include a description of who did what on the exhibit card.
 - There is no limit to the number of exhibits that a 4-Her can exhibit. However, there are limits to the lots in some divisions.
 - Did you go to camp? How about those arts and crafts projects?
 - How about those creative writing, science, or home economics school projects?
 - Exhibit those projects that you did at home for fun! Do you have a hobby or collection?

PREMIER EXHIBITOR

Any 4-Her winning a blue ribbon in 4 different divisions will be awarded a special rosette. All Premier Exhibitors will be entered into a drawing for a \$25 gift card!

FAIRFIELD COUNTY 4-H FAIR GOALS

The Fairfield County 4-H Program established the annual Fairfield County 4-H Fair with the following goals:

- to provide evaluation for 4-H member's projects.
- to provide educational experiences for members.
- to kick-off the new 4-H year.
- to provide visibility in the community.
- to provide leadership experience for seniors and selected junior 4-Hers.

 The Fairboard attempts to reach these goals for 4-H members.

4-H PHILOSOPHY OF EVALUATING

There are two major purposes of evaluating:

- to contribute to the learning experience of the 4-H member.
- to evaluate the quality of a project.

<u>Contributing to the 4-H member's learning experience</u> is important. Members should receive positive feedback as to ways they have shown themselves to be proficient as well as suggestions of ways to improve future projects. Fostering a positive self-image is our goal.

<u>Evaluating the project</u> involves an objective appraisal of the finished product (whether it is a loaf of bread or a public presentation). By using appropriate score sheets, we try to evaluate in a uniform way according to certain standards.

<u>The Danish system</u> is used at the 4-H Fair. This approach emphasizes individual achievement rather than competition. Each 4-H'er is evaluated on his/her own personal ability and experience. This means that there can be many "blue ribbons" - it is determined by individual achievement, not in relation to other entries.

Having a 4-H project evaluated should be a positive learning experience, stimulating the 4-H member to greater achievement and personal development. Therefore, always offer specific constructive written comments on what the 4-H'er has done well and ways in which they might improve.

2024 COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT

For this year's community service project, we are giving back to some of the most important people in our community, the seniors! Our goal this year is to give items to local Senior Centers! The centers are asking for donations of **all new**:

- Puzzles (100 1000 pieces)
- Board games (Checkers, Chess, Backgammon sets (moderately priced), Scrabble, Boggle, Dominos, Yahtzee, etc.)
- Simple large print adult coloring books and colored pencils
- Large print word search, sudoku, and crossword puzzle books
- Playing cards
- Dice

WHEN YOU ARRIVE AT THE FAIR

- ✓ Set-up Exhibits in the Hanson Building Exhibit Hall
- ✓ Vote for the Guessing Contests
- ✓ Enter the Pumpkin Contest (if you brought a decorated pumpkin)
- ✓ Help with the Community Service project.
- ✓ Enjoy some snacks and hot chocolate on us! No coffee or tea will be served.

Opening Ceremonies start at 10:15 a.m.

<u>Parents may not enter the Exhibit Hall</u>. There are people inside to help the younger and new 4-Hers' set up. Exhibits must be set up by 10 a.m. From 10 - 10:15 you will receive the next lower ribbon.

GENERAL FAIR GUIDELINES

- 1. **SAVE THIS BOOKLET.** Please feel free make copies of the registration forms if you need more or call the office at 203 207-8440 or e-mail donna.liska@uconn.edu. The Fair book will be posted on s.uconn.edu/fairfield4-h
- 2. All information concerning exhibits, workshops, contests, lunch and our community service project is available in this booklet. Please read each section carefully for specific guidelines.
- 3. Participation is open to any enrolled Fairfield County 4-H member aged 5 19 as of January 1, 2024. 4-Hers' may exhibit in any or all divisions as long as they meet the requirements of that division. Projects must have been completed since the last Fair 2024. Youth do not have to have a record book to enter. Please re-enroll in Z-suite after October 1.
- 4. Exhibit judging will start on time, all projects must be entered AND SET UP by 10:00 am **ABSOLUTELY NO** entries will be accepted after 10:15 am. Late entries (10 10:15) **will be penalized by receiving the next lower ribbon.**
- 5. Everyone, aged 4 and up, is asked to pay \$3 cash admission to help defray the costs of the Fair.
- 6. 4-Hers may attend the Fair without exhibiting a project but they **must** register for and attend workshops.
- 7. Workshops are for 4-H members and pre-paid guests only. 4-H members will register for and attend workshops.
- 8. We encourage all youth to exhibit at least one item and it is expected that all youth stay for the entire day. Closing Ceremonies at 2pm then Clean-up.
- 9. Have a friend that is thinking of joining 4-H? Invite them to the 4-H Fair! They can participate in workshops for a registration fee of \$5 cash.

- Any youth spending the day at the Fair must sign up for <u>and</u> attend workshops and activities.
 The exception is youth who have specific Fair responsibilities.
- Workshops are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Number your choices for each workshop slot. Every effort will be made to accommodate your first choice.
- It is expected that people will participate in the workshops assigned to them attendance is taken.

FAIRFIELD COUNTY 4-H FAIR EXHIBITS GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS - PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

All Exhibits must be pre-registered. Registration forms must be returned by mail/email to: e-mail: fairfieldcounty4Hexhibits@gmail.com

Exhibit registration must be submitted <u>no later</u> than September 27, 2024. The Exhibit Registration form should be typed or printed in ink. Include your name, age, division, number of entries and, where appropriate, size of space needed. If you have questions, please contact the office.

Upon receipt of the Fair registration form, appropriate 4-H exhibitor cards and an exhibitor # will be emailed to you to attach securely to each of your exhibit entries. Each 4-H exhibitor is assigned a number for their exhibits. Your name is not used on the exhibitor card. Every exhibit entry including different lots within a division needs to have a new exhibitor card with your # number written on it. Write the number of years you have been doing the technique on the exhibit card and not the number of years you have been in 4-H. First time exhibitors should indicate this on the exhibit registration form. Feel free to add any information to the exhibit card to help the evaluator understand the effort you made on your project.

- 1. Participation is open to any enrolled Fairfield County 4-H member or Explorer ages 5 & 6, Juniors ages 7-12 & Seniors ages 13-18 as of January 1, 2024.
- 2. 4-H members may exhibit in any or all divisions as long as they meet the requirements of that division. Some divisions have a lot limit. Please do not bring extra artwork or photos other than indicated in the division parameters. They will not be judged.
- 3. Projects must have been completed since the last 4-H Fair.
- 4. Youth do not have to have a record book to enter.
- 5. Register for only the exhibits you plan to bring to the Fair. Be realistic in your planning.
- 6. Exhibits created and submitted by more than one member must include a description of who did what on the exhibit card.
- 7. Explorers aged 5 & 6 enter only Division 24 4-H Explorers.
- 8. Judging will start on time, so all projects must be entered AND SET UP by 10:00 a.m. on Saturday morning. **ABSOLUTELY NO** entries will be accepted after **10:15 a.m.** Late entries (10am -10:15) will be penalized by receiving the next lower ribbon.
- 9. **IMPORTANT:** Each 4-Her must **set-up and take down** their own exhibits only exhibitors (4-H members) will be allowed in the exhibit hall during set-up time. Parents must wait <u>outside</u> the Exhibit Hall (Hanson Building). There are volunteers to help members' set-up. Each member must completely clean their area and dispose of debris in the proper trash can before leaving the grounds. Exhibits MUST remain in place until **after** closing ceremonies.

- 10. Any entries not meeting the specific requirements of the division will receive the next lower ribbon. For example, artwork not mounted; recipes not accompanying food exhibits or written on something other than 3" x 5" card. Please read all directions for the division carefully.
- 11. There will be no exhibit entry fee. Only the fee (\$3/per person 4 & up) to enter the Fair. Premiums will be paid to exhibitors by check and be mailed after the Fair.
- 12. Ribbons will be awarded according to the Danish System. Every Division will have a Best of Show for Junior and Senior exhibitors. Special ribbons will be awarded to youth entering designated categories and lot winners in various divisions. Team/Club exhibits will only be awarded one Best of Show rosette.
 - ➤ **New This Year!** *New* Division 23: My Plate Nutrition!
 - New This Year! We now have three "Of the Year" awards, Scientist of the Year, Artisan, and Foodie of the year awards. Please review page 5.
 - ➤ BACK THIS YEAR! A special rosette, *Premier Exhibitor*, will be awarded to 4-Hers with exhibits receiving blue ribbons in 4 separate divisions. Premier Exhibitors will be entered into a drawing for a \$25 gift card, selected at the closing ceremony.
- 13. Every precaution will be taken to ensure the safety of exhibits while they are on exhibit, but 4-H will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. All exhibitors must give personal attention to their property and at the close of the Fair and take charge of it.
- 14. The Fairboard is not responsible or liable for any accidents resulting in personal injury that occur on the grounds.
- 15. Alcoholic beverages and other controlled substances are NOT allowed. There is no smoking permitted on the grounds. No pets are allowed.
- 16. Siblings of 4-H'ers are welcome to attend if accompanied by a parent or guardian. You will need to pay for the youth to enter the Fair and CT's Beardsley Zoo.
- 17. Enrolled 4-H Explorers (youth ages 5 & 6) may exhibit in Division 24. See page 26.
- 18. PLEASE DO NOT TOUCH ANY EXHIBITS.
- 19. Any live animal exhibit must be contained in a double fenced cage or secure covered top for aquariums. At **NO** time can animals be removed from secured containers.
- 20. Space is limited for large exhibits such as booths or hobbies. On the exhibit registration form please be as exact as possible about the amount of space needed.
- 21. This year the Baking Contest is Apple Cinnamon Muffins. See the recipe on page 25.

DIVISION 1 – CLOTHING

- 1. Garments must have been made by a 4-H member since the last Fair.
- 2. Pattern envelope and directions **must** accompany garment.
- 3. All clothing must be clean, well pressed and on a hanger.
- 4. Clothing Revue garments are welcome to be displayed but cannot be judged again and will only receive a participation ribbon. Do not list Clothing Revue garments on clothing line of registration form. Please write "Do Not Judge" on exhibit cards.
- 5. Exhibits will be judged on neatness, proper use of sewing techniques, choice of fabric, condition and construction.

DIVISION 2 - FOODS

- 1. Cover all exhibits with clear transparent wrap.
- 2. Recipes, including recipe source, (include frosting recipes) **must** be provided for all food exhibits on a 3" x 5" card. They may be printed neatly (in ink), typed or copied and attached to the card.
- 3. Please note clearly if the recipe is a **gluten-free** food.
- 4. The following are <u>not allowed</u>: packaged mixes such as store-bought frostings, Bisquick, pie crust mixes, etc) beverages, and anything that needs refrigeration.
- 5. Your food will be judged on the following qualities:

Outside characteristics - (color, shape, size, frosting) Inside characteristics - (texture, grain, crumb, filling) Flavor - (pleasing blend, characteristics of product)

- 6. Exhibits in this division may include but are not limited to: (Please note that specific amounts are required for each item)
 - whole quick breads
 - 4 pieces of candy/fudge, nutritious snacks
 - 4 cookies
 - 4 muffins
 - whole cakes
 - 4 biscuits
 - loaf of bread
 - 4 cupcakes
 - whole pies
 - 4 rolls

DIVISION 3 - FOOD PRESERVATION (Canning)

- 1. All entries must have been canned by 4-H member since the last Fair.
- 2. Must use label on product. Label should include name of product, date canned and processing method used.
- 3. Jars made specifically for canning purposes must be used. Jars from commercially prepared products will be disgualified as they are unsafe for home canning.
- 4. Recipes, including recipe source, must be printed neatly (in ink) or typed on 3 x 5 card(s) and need to accompany all exhibits.
- 5. Your canning will be judged on:

 Jar well sealed, clean and neatly labeled. Processing method used. Pack full but not crowded.

 Pieces of size convenient for serving. No foreign pack. No extra credit for fancy pack. Liquid clear, not discolored. Liquid should cover the pieces. Product good texture, right stage of maturity, uniform size and shape. Appearance natural color, careful preparation.

DIVISION 4 - HORTICULTURE

- 1. All exhibits must have been grown, cared for or selected by the exhibitor. All exhibits **must** be insect free. Exhibits in this category includes flowers, vegetables, foliage plants and terrariums.
- 2. **Flowers** should be uniform in size and color with appropriate number per container. They will be judged on quality of flowers and freedom from disease. Flowers not used in an arrangement must be grown by the exhibitor.
- 3. **Arrangements** must be made by the exhibitor, but the flowers need not be grown by the exhibitor (for example, silk flowers, dried flowers or any store bought fresh flowers). *Arrangements will be judged on color, design, balance and proportion, and condition.* A good arrangement must have balance and pleasing line in its design, good color, harmony and well-related textures.
- 4. **Houseplants** must be in the exhibitor's possession for at least three months prior to the Fair. *Plants will be judged on condition, form (uniformity, shape), stem and foliage quality, color and size.* Plants must be insect free and in proper proportion to their containers. If entering houseplants: include a 3" x 5" card on which is stated how often the plant is watered and fertilized; what type of fertilizer is used and any other pertinent information regarding the care of that plant.
- 5. **Fruit &Vegetable** entries must be grown by the exhibitor. *Entries will be judged on uniformity (size, shape, color, stem quality) and condition (freshness, maturity, preparation).* Only fruits & vegetables which are of uniform size, shape and color and are at proper maturity for table use or canning should be selected. Vegetables must be clean, fresh, firm and free from blemishes caused by disease, insect and rough handling. Fruits & vegetables should be exhibited on a paper plate. (Please note that specific amounts are required for each item)

DIVISION 5 – S.T.E.M.

(Science, Technology, Engineering & Math)

- 1. Exhibits must have been made by the exhibitor since the last Fair.
- 2. Exhibits in this division include but are not limited to: veterinary science, electrical, metal, Legos (with moving pieces) and rocket projects.
- 3. Kit projects are acceptable, please indicate "Kit" on exhibitor card.
- 4. Exhibits will be judged on
 - Design (choice of materials, proportions, balance and color)
 - Workmanship (neatness, construction, finishing)
 - Creativity.

DIVISION 6 - NATURAL SCIENCES

- 1. Each article or collection must be a current 4-H project made or altered since the last Fair.
 - If entered in previous years, exhibitor <u>must</u> provide a written explanation of what has been added or changed for the current year.
- 2. Each article must have been made, collected or kept by each exhibitor.
- 3. All collections must be neatly mounted and well labeled by the exhibitor.
- 4. Exhibits in this area may include but are not limited to: forestry and wildlife collections, rocks and minerals, insects, shells, wildflowers, and ecology exhibits.
- 5. Articles will be judged on nearness, labeling, quality and completeness.

DIVISION 7 - 4-H BOOTH EXHIBITS

- 1. Exhibits in this category may be individual or done by a group of club members. If done as a group, it should be registered by only one member. The exhibitor numbers and ages of each person in the group must be on the exhibitor card. Blue, red or white ribbons will be provided to all members creating and submitting the exhibit. Only one rosette, if selected as division winner, will be awarded.
- 2. An exhibit is meant to stand on its own without explanation from members.
- 3. This division serves as an opportunity for individuals or groups of 4-H members to demonstrate a craft or skill or offer visitors information on a project or issue.
- 4. Size of exhibit (amount of space needed) MUST accompany registration. Due to limited space, a maximum of 4 feet by 2½ feet will be allowed. Display boards must be provided by exhibitor. Display MUST fit pre-measured booth area. Items on floor or walls around the booth WILL NOT be included in the booth and WILL NOT be judged.
- 5. Preparation and setting up of booths MUST be the work of club member(s) AND NOT of leaders or parents. Title of booth must be prominently displayed.
- 6. Only pre-registered booths will be accepted. All booths must be COMPLETELY set up by 9:45.
- 7. If animals are used (i.e. rabbits, hamsters, ferrets, snakes, etc.), they must be in good physical condition and free from apparent disease.
 - In accordance with state Rabies guidelines, all animals must be kept in a secure cage and must be double caged at all times.
- 8. Scoring of exhibits will be as follows:
 - a. Subject 20%
 - 1. One main idea
 - 2. Important to people (practical and timely)
 - 3. Expressed simply and clearly
 - 4. Accurate information, readable signs

- b. Public appeal 40%
 - 1. Causes people to stop and look
 - 2. Arouses and holds interest
 - 3. Will be remembered and talked about later
 - 4. If appropriate, tells where to get further information
 - c. Attractiveness 20%
 - 1. Neat.
 - 2. Good arrangement
 - 3. Simplicity
 - 4. Appropriate size and style of lettering
 - 5. If appropriate, good use of color combination
 - d. Originality 20%

DIVISION 8 – PHOTOGRAPHY

- 1. Photographs must have been taken by 4-H member since the last Fair.
- 2. All photographs must be mounted on a firm surface with at least a 1" border. DO NOT PUT IN A FRAME.
- 3. CAPTION ALL PICTURES.
- 4. Type of camera used (35mm automatic focus, Polaroid, 35mm single lens reflex, disposable, phone, digital, etc.) **MUST** be written clearly on the exhibitor card. If entries warrant, this division will be divided into traditional film and digital image. The judge may decide to award two Best of Shows.
- 4. Exhibitors may enter 2 (two) photos per Lot, up to a total of 10 photos. Additional photos will not be judged.
- 5. The winner of each Lot will receive a special ribbon. One Best of Show, per each age division will be awarded.
 - *Any Exhibitor not following these directions will lose points.
- 6. Exhibits will be judged on storytelling ability (as suggested by the caption), photographic quality, mounting and captions.

DIVISION 9 – 4-H SCRAPBOOKS

- 1. Individual or club scrapbooks may be entered. The exhibitor card must indicate if the entry is a 4-H club scrapbook or an individual 4-H scrapbook.
 - Individual scrapbooks must be about the member's experiences in the past 4-H year.
- Club scrapbooks must focus on a club's events and activities and have more than one author. In that situation, on the scrapbook exhibitor card, list all exhibitor I.D. numbers of individual club members. Blue, red or white ribbons will be provided to all members creating and submitting the exhibit. Only one rosette, if selected as division winner, will be awarded.
- 2. Scrapbooks will be judged on entries made since the previous year's Fair.
- 3. Scrapbooks will be judged on neatness, organization, interest and attractiveness



DIVISION 10 - SCRAPBOOKING

- 1. Only individual scrapbooks may be entered. Individual scrapbooks must be non-4-H related.
- 2. Scrapbooks will be judged on entries made since the previous year's Fair.
- 3. Scrapbooks will be judged on neatness, organization, interest and attractiveness.

DIVISION 11 - ART

- 1. Entries submitted must be done by a 4-H member since the last Fair.
- 2. All art work must be mounted (able to be hung on the wall), where appropriate.
- 3. Exhibitors may enter **3** art items per Lot, up to a total of 10 art items per exhibitor.
- 4. Examples of projects eligible for this division include but are not limited to: drawings, sketches, paintings, stenciling a picture, block printing and sculpture.
- 5. Art created by computer may consist of drawing by hand or the use of clip art & program-modified photos including technology such as three-dimensional renders.
- 6. Exhibits will be judged on neatness, subject matter and originality. Computerized art will also be judged on the exhibitor's knowledge of the technology and how smoothly the piece is put together.
- 7. The winner of each Lot will receive a special ribbon. One Best of Show, per each age division will be awarded.

DIVISION 12 - LEISURE ARTS

- 1. Each exhibit must have been made by the member since last year's 4-H Fair. 4-H'ers may enter no more than **5** items in this Division.
- 2. If item is a club project, please check the appropriate box on exhibitor card. Indicate any camp or school project as well. If a kit craft is used, please indicate on exhibitor card "kit craft". Also note that the section on the entry card asking for "years in project" should indicate the number of years you have been using this technique or doing this particular craft, not the number of years in the leisure projects in general.
- 3. If an item is pottery, ceramic or clay, please indicate the following:
 - Item thrown on a potter's wheel by 4-H'er.
 - Created from a slab of clay by 4-H'er.
 - Purchased green ware.
- 4. Examples of projects eligible for this division include but are not limited to: carving, pottery, collage, decoupage, ceramics, jewelry, leather work, nature craft, basketry, bead work, macramé, papiermâché, candles, mobiles, mosaic, stenciling, paper craft, tie dyeing, soft sculpture, kit crafts, paint by number, holiday decoration, kites, or a mold made by 4-H'er.
- 5. Exhibits will be judged on neatness, correct preparation and finish and quality of work.

DIVISION 13 – HOBBY COLLECTIONS

- 1. Exhibits in this division <u>must only be</u> the work of the 4-H member. Each exhibit must be a current collection or one that has been altered since the last Fair. If entered in previous years, exhibitor <u>must</u> provide a written explanation of what has been added or changed this year.
- 2. Size of space needed MUST accompany registration. Due to limited space, a maximum of 4 feet by 2½ feet will be allowed. **Only pre-registered hobby exhibits will be accepted.**
- 3. Animals are not a hobby collection and may only be exhibited as part of a booth exhibit.
- 4. Every effort should be made to omit or cover exhibitor's name from collection
- 5. Examples of projects eligible for this division include but are not limited to: baseball card, horses, dolls, stamps, Legos without moving parts, coins.
- 6. Exhibits will be judged on correctness of labels, neatness, and methods of display (originality) and titles. Also explain your interest in this hobby collection. In judging collections, the size and value of the collection is not as important as the neatness, methods of display, proper labeling and titles.

DIVISION 14 - HOME ARTS

- 1. Each exhibit must have been made by the member since the last Fair.
- 2. If a kit craft is used, please indicate on exhibitor card "kit craft".
- 3. If item is a club project, please check the appropriate box on exhibitor card. Indicate any camp or school project as well.
- 4. Similar or identical items are limited to two individual exhibits per person. If there are more than two similar items in this category, they must be grouped as one exhibit.
- 5. Examples of projects eligible for this division include but are not limited to: crochet or knit articles, embroidery, needlepoint, cross-stitch, quilting, hooking, pillows, tote bags, pajama bags, bean bags, pin cushions or stuffed toys.
- 6. Exhibits will be judged on neatness, correct preparation and finish and quality of workmanship.

DIVISION 15 - RECORD BOOKS

- 1. To be eligible for this division, a 4-H'er must have received a blue ribbon at the county evaluation.
- 2. Your completed evaluation sheet from this year <u>MUST</u> be inserted on top of this year's activity record sheet or it cannot be considered for this division.
- 3. No exhibitor card is needed for this division.
- 4. 4-H member **SHOULD NOT** make changes to record book following county evaluation held earlier in the fall before submitting for consideration for Best of Show. Because record books have already been judged, only three best of show ribbons will be awarded in this division: one for juniors, one for seniors and one for first year books.
- 5. Books will be judged on neatness, accuracy, completeness, effort put forth and arrangement.

DIVISION 16 - WOODCRAFTS

- 1. Exhibits must have been made by the exhibitor since the last Fair.
- 2. Kit projects are acceptable, please indicate "kit" on exhibitor card
- 3. Exhibits in this division include but are not limited to: birdhouse or feeder, tray, shelf, bookends, stool, bookcases and other wooden projects.
- 4. Exhibits will be judges on design (choice of materials, proportions, balance and color), workmanship (neatness, construction, finishing) and creativity.



DIVISION 17 - COMMUNICATIONS

- 1. For Junior 4-Hers all written work should be neat and easy to read; it may be typed.
- 2. For Senior 4-Hers all written work should be typed with double spacing unless it is part of the creative presentation of the work.
- 3. Previously evaluated work (such as school reports) is acceptable if it fulfills the criteria below. A clean copy of such work should be entered work with grades or comments will not be judged.
- 4. Exhibits can include but are not limited to:
 - Original Essay (not to exceed 5 pages)
 - Original Research Reports (not to exceed 5 pages)
 - Original Short Story
 - Original Poetry Collection (up to 5 pieces)
 - Other original miscellaneous written work
 - Original Web Page (printout is acceptable)
 - Original 4-H Press Release
- 5. All work will be evaluated on content, correctness, neatness and presentation.

DIVISION 18 - CAREER EXPLORATION

Poster can be on <u>standard poster board</u> and must be of uniform size 22" X 28" or a <u>standard tri-fold board</u> 36" X 48" - other sizes are ineligible. Use a theme to select a career <u>you</u> are interested in and share it with us! For example: "Explore Nursing."

- 1. Posters must contain artwork or text created by the 4-Her.
- 2. Pictures or diagrams may be drawn by the 4-Her or neatly cut out from other sources (magazines, website printouts, etc.). If not original work the source should be cited.
- 3. Do not attach items thicker than the poster board to the poster.
- 4. Keep it simple and to the point.
- 5. Exhibits will be judged on originality, follows the theme, conveys easily understood message, accurate information and general appearance.

DIVISION 19 - 4-H BAKING CONTEST

- 1. Entries must be covered with clear plastic wrap.
- 2. Participants must be enrolled in Fairfield County 4-H.
- 3. All entries will be judged on the Danish system. A Best in Show Rosette may be awarded in each section.
- 4. Entries will be judged on the following qualities:
 - Outside characteristics (color, shape, size, frosting)
 - Inside characteristics (texture, grain, crumb, filling)
 - Flavor (pleasing blend, characteristics of product)

4-H BAKING CONTEST RECIPE

Easy Apple Cinnamon Muffins

1 ½ cups all-purpose flour

3/4 cup white sugar

½ teaspoon salt

2 teaspoons baking powder

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1 egg

1/3 cup milk

¹/₃ cup vegetable oil

2 apples, peeled, cored and chopped

Topping: ½ cup white sugar

½ cup butter, cubed

1/3 cup all-purpose flour

1 ½ teaspoon ground cinnamon

Prep 20m Cook 25m Ready in 45m

- 1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Grease six muffin cups or line with paper muffin liners.
- 2. Stir together 1 ½ cup flour, ¾ cup sugar, salt, baking powder and 1 teaspoon cinnamon. Mix in oil, egg and milk. Fold in apples. Spoon batter into prepared muffin cups, filling to the top of the cup.
- 3. In a small bowl, stir together $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar, $\frac{1}{3}$ cup flour, butter and $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoons cinnamon. Mix together with a fork and sprinkle over unbaked muffins.
- 4. Bake in pre heated oven for 20 to 25 minutes, until a toothpick inserted into center of a muffin comes out clean.
- 5. Exhibit by placing 4 of your best muffins on a plate and covering them with plastic wrap

DIVISION 20 - 4-H GOES GREEN!!!

- 1. Entries may be no more than 18 inches long by 18 inches wide (not including hanging materials). Entries must consist entirely of recycled or repurposed materials in keeping with the "Green" theme. Can't think of anything? What about wind chimes, an art project, a sculpture, or some technology?
- 2. Entries will be judged on the following qualities:
 - Attractiveness 30%
 - Originality 20%
 - Workmanship 15%
 - Suitability of materials 35%

DIVISION 21 – VETERINARY SCIENCE

- 1. Any Articles in this class must have been made by the exhibitor by last 4-H Fair date.
- 2. No more than two entries per lot. Each entry must be different. All work must be original. No kits can be used.
- 3. Box projects are displays which are at least the size of a shoebox, but no larger than a three section display board 36" height X 24" Width X 12" Depth. Posters must be no larger than 24" X 36".
- 4. Entries will be judged on the following qualities:
 - Attractiveness 30%
 - Originality 20%
 - Workmanship 15%
 - Accuracy 35%

Lots:

- 1. Poster or box project about an animal disease.
- 2. Poster or box project about the anatomy of a specific animal.
