## Name

When referring to the College and 4-H organization...

- Use UConn not UCONN
- Use 4-H not 4H

4-H ✓ 4H ✗

UConn ✓ UCONN ✗

## When should I use logos/ names?

On everything! All communications from your club and county should include UConn Extension and 4-H. The 4-H name and emblem also needs to be included on apparel, signage, displays, banners and items such as robots that include sponsors or organizational branding.

## What is the official 4-H Clover?

- The stem of the clover goes to the right
- The statement "18 USC 707" must legibly appear
- The color is either official 4-H Green or black/white



## Logos

- Don't distort or stretch logo (size proportionately)
- Don't make the logos too small OR too large.
- Do not put anything behind or in front of logos
- ONLY USE THE OFFICIAL 4-H CLOVER
- USE ONLY THE OFFICIAL UCONN LOGO

## Fonts

UConn Branding Standards allow for flexibility, keep to similar styles if you don't have access to these fonts. Below are popular recommendations.

*Serif fonts work best in print. Sans serif fonts work best for online.*

- Korolev, Open Sans, or Merriweather for the Headers/Subheaders.
- Adobe Garamond Pro/Garamond or Times New Roman for main body text in printed materials.
- Arial, Avenir, Proxima Nova or Open Sans for main body text for online materials.

## Equal Opportunity Statement

All 4-H materials MUST include the 4-H logo. The logo can be at top with UConn logo (like above) OR somewhere else on the page.

All 4-H materials MUST include the Equal Opportunity Statement. Text can be smaller than other text on the page but make sure it is still legible.
